FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK....

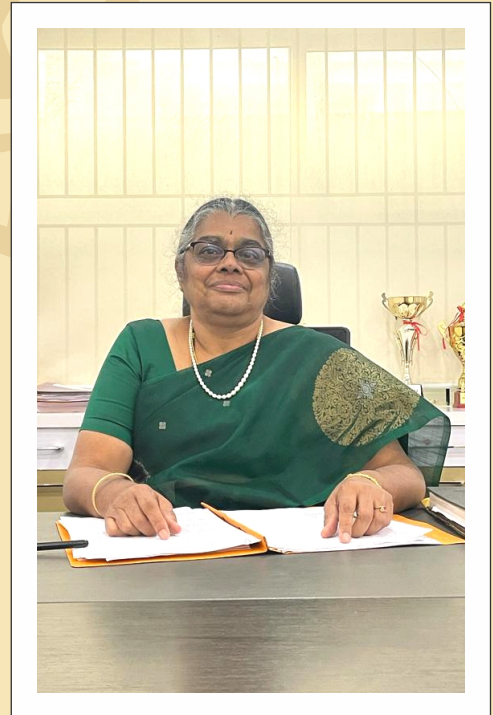
Dear Parents,

Students had a glimpse of architecture, panchayat, traditional occupations, crafts, day to day lifestyle of people in villages, etc. The students observed the scenario of the Model Village with great enthusiasm, thereby gaining an insight into the lifestyle of the people of rural Karnataka.





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
